Step 4: Registering Your Business

Incorporated businesses must file the following documents with the North Carolina Secretary of State.
-Articles of Incorporation
-Application for Certificate of Authority to transact business in North Carolina by out-of-state businesses.

Step 10: Food Services

Businesses serving food: restaurants, hotels, catering, food vendors, daycares, summer camps, and bed and breakfasts require a health permit. Permits are issued through Buncombe County.

Step 11: Overnight Accommodations

There are special requirements for businesses providing accommodations. Hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts, cabins and room rentals require a health permit. In addition accommodations with five rooms or more must also collect room tax. All must collect sales tax.

Business name registration is not a requirement but is recommended.

Step 14: Business (Privilege) License

The Town of Black Mountain in most cases requires a business license to conduct business.

Required business taxes vary by type of ownership, use of employees, and type of product or service. Talk with an accountant who focuses on small businesses to identify your tax responsibilities and deadlines.

Businesses need a verified physical address and 911 registration prior to applying for utilities. Assistance or questions may be addressed by calling (828) 255-5638.
